Quiz Show Challenge



The Challenge

As Neighbourhood Teams, create a multimedia presentation based on your informed citizenship project being investigated and a set of related quiz questions to test the knowledge of each Neighbourhood.

The Challenge in Detail

To create a presentation based on your Neighbourhood's **Informed Citizenship** focus to share as part of a whole school 'Quiz Show' at 2:00 p.m. in Zone 21. A set of **six** questions must accompany each presentation to be asked to opposing Neighbourhood Teams. **Bonus points** will be awarded for creativity and the quality of questions presented.

Neighbourhood Projects include ...

Prep/One	Saving Loggerhead Turtles
Two/Threes	Water Systems and Weather
Four/Fives	Butterfly Replenishment and Northern Hairy Nosed Wombat Preservation
Six/Sevens	Deforestation

Neighbourhood Teams are challenged to produce a two to three minute **multimedia presentation** using their own choice of mode and medium. For example, a MovieMaker or Photostory documentary, PowerPoint presentation, an animation, a song with background slides, a pod/vodcast, etc. You are only limited by your imagination ! A USB is provided to store it.

The presentation must inform your audience of your project with some key information you would be able to ask some challenging questions on. Presentations should feature video, audio and visuals.

The Questions

Five, carefully composed and challenging questions need to be written based on Bloom's Taxonomy or the Question Matrix provided to promote higher order thinking and comprehension. A variety of questions should be provided as well as a range of responses including multiple choice, true/false, short answer, visual/auditory questions, etc. Teams may also wish to be clever in the way questions are presented, for example the use of a 'blurred' image as shown below. These are to be presented as a PowerPoint presentation also stored on the USB provided.



All teams must also include a sixth 'What or Who Am I ?' question with **eight** individual clues, with each clue worth **ten points**. If the question is answered correctly at Clue One, eighty points will be awarded ! This is to be presented on paper only for the compere.

All questions must be presented as a **PowerPoint Presentation** for public display with a **Quiz Sheet** for the Quiz Master and distribution to other teams and an **Answer Sheet** for the judges. All materials need to be stored on the USB memory stick in your Challenge Day Pack.

The Quiz

Each Neighbourhood must nominate an **adult** from their Neighbourhood to represent them in the Quiz Show. A **profile of this person** will need to be developed and produced in any media to share at **2:00 p.m.** on the screens in Zone 21. This may take the form of a video interview, film clip, PowerPoint presentation, a PhotoStory compilation, etc. An example is outlined below for you as a guide.

During the quiz, there will be **five rounds** as detailed below ...

Round One	Prep/One's Presentation and Questions
Round Two	Two/Three's Presentation and Questions
Round Three	Four/Five's Presentation and Questions
Round Four	Six/Seven's Presentation and Questions
Round Five	Mr Walker's General Knowledge Questions
Round Six	Tie Breaker Round (If required)

Points and Judging

Points will be allocated according to the Criteria and Judging Sheet. Each question asked is worth **ten** points.

Extra Points

- A **mascot** that represents your project (500 points)
- An **A3 colour poster** to promote your project that is created electronically, printed and laminated for display and inclusion in our next Newsletter. This may be scanned to create the electronic copy. (250 points)
- A **banner** to identify your Neighbourhood (250 points)
- A **recorded song** to introduce your Neighbourhood (300 points)
- A **distinct item** related to your Project to be worn by the Neighbourhood contestant (200 points)
