# Virtue of the Week

This week, we explore the virtue of **assertiveness**. Being assertive means being positive and confident. It begins by being aware that we are all worthy people with our own special gifts and talents. When we are assertive, we think for ourselves and ask for what we need. We have the self confidence to tell the truth about what is just. Please consider discussing being **assertive** with your child[ren] this week.

# Principal's Message

Congratulations are extended to all our learners on an amazing start to Term Four. All learners are engaged, actively participating and developing their knowledge and skills around the new concepts being taught. Classroom **Learning Walls** are resources that assist learners to develop their assessment capability and understand what they may need to show and do to achieve at a particular standard. These walls may also include a 'Bump It Up' aspect to determine the 'next steps' required to achieve at the next level. For example, in the area of writing, there may be some specific elements that take current writing samples from a 'C' standard to a 'B' standard.

When learners begin to develop their individual knowledge of assessment and grow their capability through feedback, their assessment capability becomes embedded as part of the learning process. Another common feature of Learning Walls are anchor charts that provide learners with access to information regarding the current topics and

content. These charts are often referred to as the 'second' or 'third' teacher, allowing learners to access these independently when required. Examples may be definitions, processes, specific vocabulary and exemplars, also referred to as 'WAGOLLs' (What A Good One Looks Like). Parents and Carers are also encouraged to peruse Classroom Learning Walls to develop your understanding of the learning focus for the Term.



Over the past two weeks, all Parkhurst State School learners have had an opportunity to participate in Swimming Lessons. **Water Safety and Swimming Programs** are compulsory and mandated components of the Australian Curriculum and it is expected that all learners participate as part of their access to the school's Health and Physical Education Program. A big thank you is extended to **Mr David Johnson** for all of his work in organising our P-6 Swimming Program, including the facilitation of lessons for our Year 4-6 learners.

# **Term Four Swimming Program**

As part of every Queensland Schools' Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Framework (CARF), the delivery of a Water Safety and Swimming Program for all Prep to Year Six learners is compulsory.



Parkhurst State School has provided such programs for over a decade at a number of local venues. In Term Four, as a result of the Central Queensland University's Sports Complex Pool closing, the Year 4-6 Swimming Program will be convened from the North Rockhampton Pool in Berserker Street. This Program will be facilitated by Mr David Johnson and other Austswim accredited Staff, including gualified Swim Teachers at the Northside Pool.

Our Prep to Year Three Learners' Swimming Program will once again be convened at the **Caribeae Swim** Academy in Menzies Street. A special note was sent home last Term, outlining the specific details of this year's Swimming Program, including the day[s]. time[s] and costs, including pool entry, transport and instruction. A special thank you is extended to Mr David Johnson and Mrs Chris Olive for all of their work in preparing for this year's Swimming Program.

# **Queensland Mental Health Week**



Queensland Mental Health Week is scheduled from October 09<sup>th</sup> 2021 to October 17<sup>th</sup> 2022. This is an opportunity for all schools to shine the spotlight on mental health and wellbeing. The theme of Mental Health Week this year is

'Take Time for Mental Health'. The theme recognises the importance of taking time to engage in activities that boost our mental health and encourages help seeking behaviours, when needed.

Research shows there are six simple actions we can take to improve our moods, build resilience, and boost wellbeing. These simple actions are from the Queensland Government's Dear Mind initiative and are based on the internationally recognised Wheel of Wellbeing. Regularly practicing these actions is beneficial for everyone.

- 1. **Get healthy** by being active and eating well is good for your mind as well as your body
- 2. **Keep learning** by learning new things can make you more confident as well as being fun
- 3. Show kindness by practising small acts of kindness, volunteering time, or simply helping a friend in need can help you feel more satisfied with life
- 4. **Connect** with others by spending time with other people is important to everyone's mental wellbeing
- 5. **Take notice** by paying more attention to the present and the world around you helps relieve stress and enjoy the moment
- 6. **Embrace nature** by connecting with the outdoors and taking care of the planet is the best recipe for world wellbeing.



At Parkhurst State School, our Well Being Team have coordinated a range of activities to promote the well being of our learners and Staff. Embedded practices in the school include our daily Smart Moves Program Jump Jam (in Terms One and Four) and Oval Walk (in Terms Two and Three), Daily Muster, Daily Check Ins, Emotion Walls, special Lunchtime Sports competitions, Lunchtime Clubs, Neighbourhood Centre Activities and ongoing positive recognition.




