Many learners are already highly proficient in using OneNote. Microsoft OneNote is available as a free Microsoft Office download.

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Learning at Home in Weeks One and Two

The Department of Education has stated that all Queensland Schools will be open for children of essential workers. The Department also state that if a child is able to learn from home, they should learn from home and will be supported by the materials, resources and processes established by schools to facilitate this. Learners of essential workers attending Parkhurst State School will engage in the activities planned by Teachers last Term to ensure a consistency in curriculum. From Week Three to Week Five, we will transition to learning delivered via our online resources, including our YouTube Channel, SoundCloud and Microsoft OneNote.

On our school website, under the 'Curriculum' tab, there is a 'Learning@Home' menus that contain information, resources, learning tasks and activities for learners to undertake. These have been organised by Learning Neighbourhood (ie; P/1, 2/3, 4/5 and Year 6), Specialist Learning Areas and school focus/priority areas. Learning Grids

Every Learning Neighbourhood has developed Learning Grids for Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Spelling, Social and Emotional Learning and Integrated Studies. Learners are encouraged to make daily choices of tasks and activities over the fortnight period and complete their work in a scrapbook or exercise book. As tasks and activities are completed, the section of the grid is coloured as a guide to what options remain.

PAWS Reading

Reading remains front and centre as our school improvement priority and focus. **P**ractise **A**chieves **W**eekly **S**uccess. Every Parkhurst State School learner is encouraged to continue their nightly reading to collect their PAWS. Just as there are four pads on a PAW, we encourage every learner to read for at least four nights each week. Prompt sheets, suggested questions and activity responses are included in the PG2E as well as in the Learning Packs.

What can I do to get ready for home learning?

Teachers and School Staff have been working hard to plan for home based learning and have developed learning programs that best suit the learners at our school. Your child/ren's teacher/s will be in contact with you early next week to let you know what to expect and how you can best support your child/ren's learning.

To support parents and carers, some tips have been put together to make the transition easier ...

- Treat the first week as a 'starting school' or orientation type of week. Not everything will go to plan, and it might take a while to work out how to find and use the right resources and understand what's best for you and your child. The 'how to' will come first, and then the learning.
- Remember that your child/ren's teacher/s usually divide their attention between up to 28 learners who all work at different paces and need different levels of support. At home, two to three hours of learning each day will usually be plenty. Try using a range of other activities to keep children engaged and stimulated without becoming overwhelmed.
- Routines and consistency can be a source of comfort for parents and children alike, but keep in mind that your routine doesn't have to be the same as a school routine.
 If you use a timetable at home, make sure it's manageable for everyone and flexible enough that you can adapt it as you learn what works.
- This situation presents an opportunity for learners to find out more about themselves as learners and to become more confident in self-directing their learning.

Encourage your child to take responsibility for not only learning but also for staying in touch with their teacher, their class and their friends and community.

- If your child/ren is finding a task difficult, make suggestions and answer questions, but try to let them figure things out for themselves as much as possible. Give them opportunities, where appropriate, to take control of their own learning.
- Remember this is new for us, too. You can help us succeed by letting us know if you're unsure about something and using the preferred contact time and method that your teacher will advise you of.
