At this time, I am conscious of keeping communication traffic to a minimum, so as not to bombard, overload or confuse families. Over the past fortnight, Teachers have been the central communicators to check in, share resources and troubleshoot as required. Learning@Home

By the end of this week, information, resources and links will be sent home to all families via Classroom Teachers. A variety of platforms are being used and by now your child(ren)'s Class Teacher(s) would have established this with you. Learning over the next three weeks will be a little different. Please consider the activity sheets and handouts as you would the Class Teacher's WhiteBoard or Interactive Whiteboard. These materials do not necessarily require printing as the work can be completed in an exercise book or in the Class OneNote for sharing at a later date.

Some families have requested hard, printed copies of the materials to support Learning@Home over the next three weeks. If you require any printed resources, please contact your child(ren)'s Classroom Teachers via email or telephone and copies can be arranged for collection. Likewise, if you do not have access to the Internet, a USB of the YouTube and SoundCloud media can be created to use in Smart TVs.
