Today we're looking at similes. Similes are a part of figurative language. They're used to make our narrative writing more interesting. Similes really help to give your reader a vivid picture of the setting.

Similes describe things that are like other things using the words **like** or **as**. Here is an example of simple simile's using like or as!

It's was as hot **as** an oven outside!

The stars were sparkling **like** diamonds in the night sky.

"You're as stubborn **as** an ox!" she shouted.

The thunder was **like** an explosion in the sky.

Similes in year 4 and 5 need to be extended, we need to add more to the sentence. Here is an example:

The sun was **like** a glistening yellow marble in the sky.

Cody's room smelt **like** the inside of an old lunch box with tuna inside.
